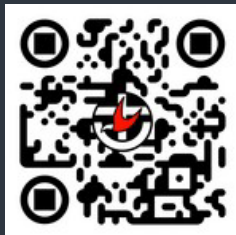

Thought for the week

How can we explain the Trinity?

In our three-dimensional world one person can look or behave or sound like someone else. But a person cannot be the same as another person. God, however, lives without the limitations of a three-dimensional universe. He is Spirit. That is why Jesus the Son can be different from the Father. And, yet the same.

The Bible speaks of ... God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit, but emphasizes that there is only ONE God. If we were to use mathematics, it would not be, 1+1+1=3. It would be 1x1x1=1. God is a triune God. The term "Tri" meaning three, and "Unity" meaning one, Tri+Unity = Trinity. What the Bible tells us about God, is that God is three "Persons" who have the same divine essence.

In Genesis we see God as a Triune God who said, "Let us make man in our image... male and female he created them"; When Moses asked God for His name, God replied, "I am" - always existing. Jesus used the same phrase: "I am the light .. the bread...the way".

"All three Persons in the Trinity have relational names. The First Person in the Trinity is called Father. You cannot be called The Father unless you have a child. And you cannot be called The Son unless you have a Father. The Third Person in the Trinity is called both The Spirit of The Father (Matt 10:20) and Spirit of The Son (Gal 4:4- 6)."For all of eternity, the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have always been in relationship and communication with each other, yet not as three gods...but one God. 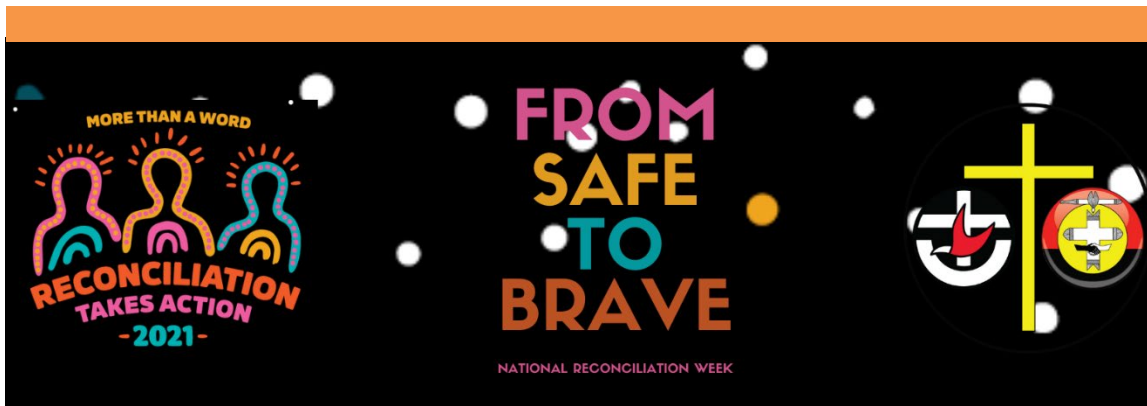
